About the RAP program

- Community Corrections program at Douglas County Dept. of Corrections
- Majority of clients have felony charges
- Only community corrections program that allows presentenced inmates



About the RAP program

- All clients work with the case manager to create an individualized reentry plan
- Clients take a variety of classes to reduce criminogenic thinking and recidivism
- Earn access to the community to meet a variety of goals on their reentry plan

Barriers to Housing

- Mental health issues
- Employer stigma/lack of education
- Lack of resources
- Nature of criminal charges
- Unknown status of current criminal case
- Loss of benefits upon incarceration



Barriers to Housing

- Personal barriers of reentering persons
 - Financial Criminal history
 - Health Custody issues
 - Criminogenic Thinking
- These barriers may result in relapse, reoffending and/or living in unsafe environments



Overcoming Barriers

- Address mental health issues
- Address addiction
- Classes to increase skills
- Community outreach and inreach
- Communication with court personnel
- Addressing any personal barriers



Opportunities for Improvement

- Ban the Box" Nebraska LB907
- Increase education for renters and employers
- Flexibility for the pre-sentenced client
- Payment plans & budget assistance
- Increase in transitional housing options
- Public transportation access



Opportunities for Improvement

- Increase funding for returning citizens
- Specified government assistance
- -Reentry Grant: assist individuals prior to release
